The RCS will present a vibrant programme inspired by the collection from September 2025 to March 2026. This special concert series features eight unique performances showcasing 25 outstanding young musicians from the Conservatoire.

Spanning Medieval, Persian, Folk, Classical, Jazz, Scots Traditional, and World music genres, these performances will bring a rich tapestry of sounds to the Burrell. Each concert is curated in response to the architecture, spaces, and artworks of the collection, offering audiences new ways to connect with music and visual art. Taking place in a variety of locations throughout the museum, these performances aim to invite visitors to encounter the building and its treasures through fresh musical perspectives and atmospheric experiences. All performances are free and non-ticketed.

Apollo's Melody is a Glasgow-based flute and harp duo founded in 2023, featuring Lily Brown (flute) and Yeva Panchenko (harp). Since their formation, they have performed extensively across Scotland, captivating audiences with a vibrant repertoire spanning various eras and musical traditions from around the world. Their concert on 13 September at the Burrell Collection presents a refreshed programme, including works by Debussy, Ibert, Mouquet, Rimsky-Korsakov, Henson-Conant, Rizza, and others.

Atelier Ensemble

Atelier Ensemble is a Glasgow-based piano trio, exploring music new and old as they perform timeless classical and romantic pieces, uncover lesser-known music, and improvise together. Comprised of American violinist Elizabeth Gange, Slovak American cellist Rebekah Woodier, and South Korean pianist Sinae Sung, they have been playing together for over four years.

Having begun at RCS as a piano quartet, their early highlights as a group include premiering composer Amy Simpkin's piece 1.5 Degrees at Aberdeen's Sound Festival in 2021, receiving highly commended at RCS's Governor's Recital Prize for Chamber Music, and winning first place at the Dunbar-Gerber Chamber Music Competition, both in 2023. Since then, they joined Live Music Now and perform across Scotland in community settings and concerts.

Timmy Allan and Annabel Stevens

Timmy Allan began his musical career on the streets of Glasgow busking with the Glasgow early jazz quintet 'Awkward Family Portraits'. The band then went onto play on BBC Radio Scotland, Basque radio stations round the north of Spain and also some Friesland (NL) regional TV stations as well as playing Festivals round the UK and Netherlands including Belladrum, TRNSMT, Kelburn Garden Party, and Wild Rooster(NL). Allan then joined with Glasgow singer icon 'Kitti' exercising his contemporary jazz/neo soul capabilities.

He then moved to Birmingham to study jazz more intensively under the tutelage of Chris Montague, Mark Hodgson and Andrew Bain before moving back to Glasgow and winning the BBC Scotland Young Jazz 2024 and also received a nomination for the Scottish Jazz Awards 2024. Timmy Allan has now graduated from the jazz Course at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland with honours and won the prestigious Alan McAuley Jazz Award 2025. Allan will also be making some appearances with his new original music at Glasgow and Edinburgh Jazz Festival 2025.

Timmy Allan and Annabel Stevens will be reimagining works from the romantic, neo classical periods and early music on electric guitar and violin.

Rosie Byres Trio

At the age of 20, Rose Byers has already made a name for herself on the traditional music scene. She is passionate about Scots Song, in particular the works of Robert Burns, and has performed and played the fiddle across the country, from the Scottish Parliament to Celtic Connections.

With her beautiful clear voice, she has attracted a growing audience. In 2021 she won a Creative Scotland to record her first single, which she wrote with Aaron Jones. Among her awards are the British Museum's National Volunteer of the Year for her work as junior ambassador of Ellisland, Burns' farm near Auldgirth. She will also named Dumfries & Galloway Life Magazine Performer of the Year in 2018.

She has performed with her trio at various events, but most notably in Brussels for the Scottish Government Burns Evening, in 2025. Rose is currently on a four-year degree in Traditional Music at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow.
