Relationships between men were common in Ancient Rome.

The Roman Emperor, Hadrian was in love with a young man called Antinous, and proudly showed their love for each other in public.

When Antinous died, Hadrian was devastated. Hadrian had a sculpture made of Antinous for his garden to remember him.

This large marble vase was discovered in the gardens of Hadrian's Villa in 1771, alongside a statue of Antinous.
